Points Work System: Points are worth \$15 per point and members need 8 per year to renew their member ship. You can buy points at the end of the year during renewal, if you have not earned enough points. Super Seniors can work off their membership fee by earning 8 points.

Junior members do not need to earn points

Families only need to earn 8 points within the group

Members who live more than 70 miles from the flying field do not need points for renewal, but donations for field maintenance are gladly received.

Some might not consider a plastic model within the realm of "models" that pique our interests, but fact is, most scale RC modelers routinely default to a scale plastic model kit of their chosen subject. The finer quality plastic model kits generally feature a host of scale details that aid the RC model builder in producing an accurate scale flying rendition.



A longtime acquaintance of mine works for a gentleman in Texas who just so happens to own an impressive collection of full-scale warbirds and other classic aircraft. I was contacted and asked if I might know of someone capable of building accurately detailed scale plastic models which duplicate all their full-scale aircraft... John Eaton came to mind, as I was aware that John was an experienced plastic model builder. I was NOT aware of the level of fine quality detail John was capable of reproducing, as you will see from some of his completed models.

Turns out John and a fellow modeler agreed to build some of the replica models being requested and I thought it might be fun to share some of their completed projects here. Below are a U-2F and an RF-86F John built for the Vacaville Rowland Museum in 1/48 scale.

John is currently in the painting stage of a Spitfire Mk 5B for the museum.

A fellow scale plastic modeler, Howard Weaver, has completed a North American A-36 for the museum @ 1/32 scale. Span is 13 and 7/8"








This month John is also sharing his plans for a SAFE Lithium polymer battery storage solution...


We all have a pile of Lithium Polymer batteries and storage can be a problem. I have them for airplanes of course, but also grandkid cars and other toys. Then there are the yard and shop tools, which may be the ones most likely to be left in unsafe circumstances. I have a metal tool box for my airplane batteries, and use Harbor Freight metal ammunition cans for the others. I line them with sheetrock because it is a good thermal barrier and hopefully the metal contains heat and flame as well. I store them on concrete surfaces away from combustibles. Here are some photos and drawings of how the ammunition cans are done. The sheetrock is cut so the ends run across at alternate ends and surround the bottom sheet so they stay in place. It takes a 2 X 4 piece of sheetrock, 2 X2 is not quite enough. The toolbox is similar but different sizes of course.














Lastly, work continues almost daily on my 1/5 scale Grumman F8F Bearcat from Jerry Bates plans. I recently completed sheeting the wing and it was time to cut-out the sheeting to accommodate the landing gear and wheels. If you have ever tried to cut a perfect circle in wing sheeting, you know it can be a challenge. Also, what you find is that the cutout for the wheels is NOT located at the exact spot where the wheels are fully retracted because the landing gear moves in an ARC such that the wheel cut-outs must be enlarged to allow the wheels sufficient clearance going into and out of the wing. Using a wheel as a template, I marked circles on the wing in the approximate location of the cut-outs. Once the rough cut-outs




were made, I then used a Dremel to get them closer to the exact sizes they needed to be. However, enlarging the cut-outs, while keeping them as close to perfectly circular as possible was a head scratcher..? What I did was find something I could use as a sanding template to enlarge the cut-outs, keeping them close to perfectly circular AND concentric with the wheel axles... That 'something?'

An old macaroni salad container! Below is the container with sandpaper taped to the exterior.







I then cut a hole in the center of the plastic container so that it would be centered in the wheel pocket and rotate on the wheel axle as I spun it clockwise and counter clockwise to sand/enlarge the hole while keeping it concentric. No, the plastic container will no longer be useful for containing any type of liquid, but hey, in the production of a scale model, *sacrifices must be made*.

When it comes to installing retracts, "trial and error" is the order of the day, though I will say that this time around, my Bearcat retract install has been MUCH easier than the first time around!

Well, that about wraps it up for now.
